Arriving by car

The Haus der Universität is located in a pedestrian zone and cannot be reached by car directly, although access for taxis is permitted.

Arriving by plane


The Düsseldorf airport is one of the biggest in Europe. There is a train terminal within the airport which enables a direct connection to the main station ("HBF") via the "S-Bahn S11" (approx. 12 minutes). Please use this train and not the SkyTrain to go to Flughafen Bahnhof (a connection to the city from there is also possible, but cumbersome).

From the main train station, use the underground to get to the Haus der Universität (see below).

Arriving by train

The Düsseldorf main station ("HBF") is connected to all international long-distance train routes. The underground station is located in the basement floor. All lines are connected to the station "Heinrich-Heine-Allee" close to the Haus der Universität (3rd stop, around 3 minutes travel time).
